

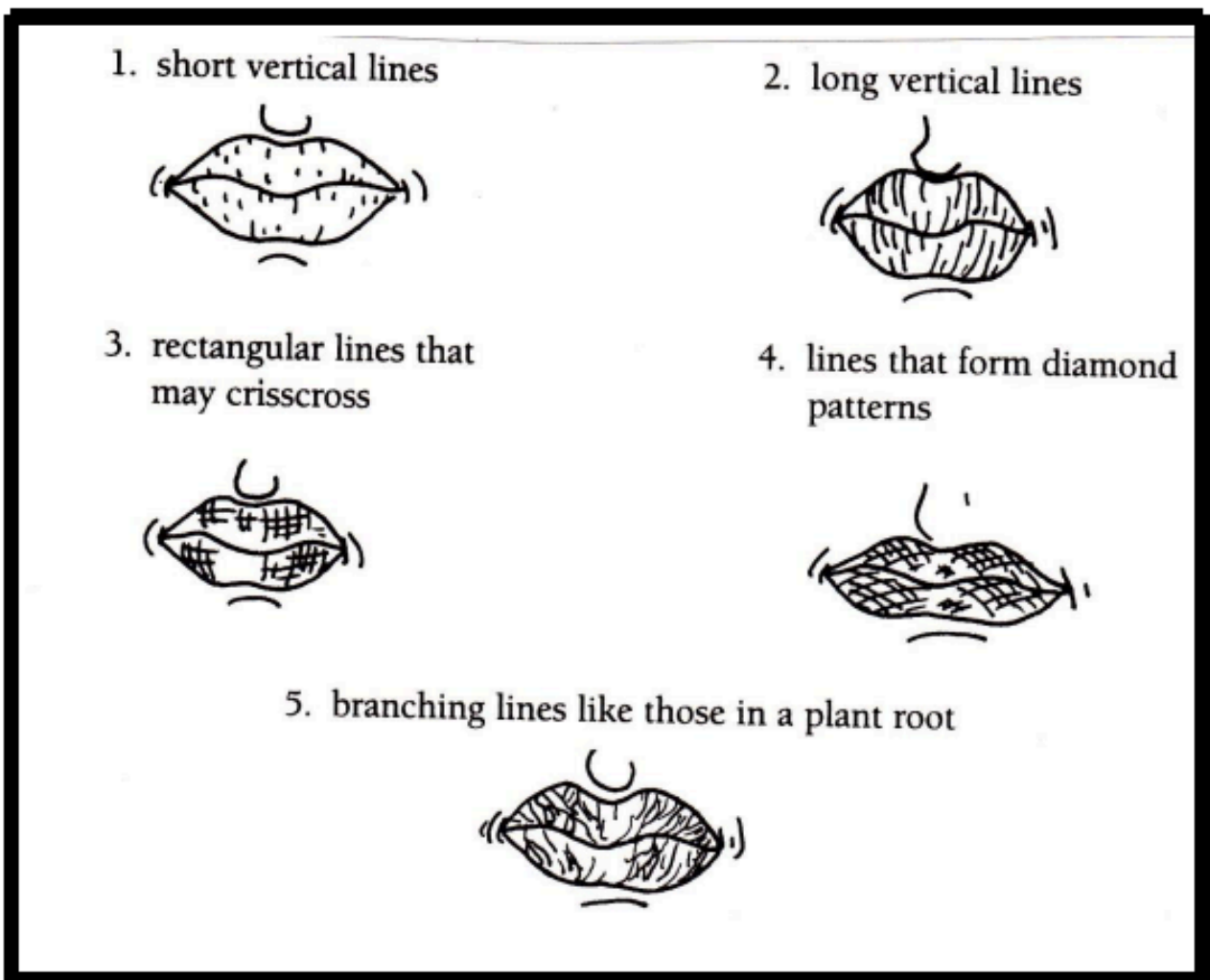
Backboard Information on Lip Print Analysis

The study of lip prints is called cheiloscropy. A person's lip prints are unique, quite similar to fingerprints. The use of lip prints in criminal cases is limited because the credibility of lip prints has not been firmly established in our courts.

Two ways of potentially using lip prints:

1. Print patterns for identification
2. Chromatography to match lipstick marks

The five basic types of lip prints used by forensic scientists are:

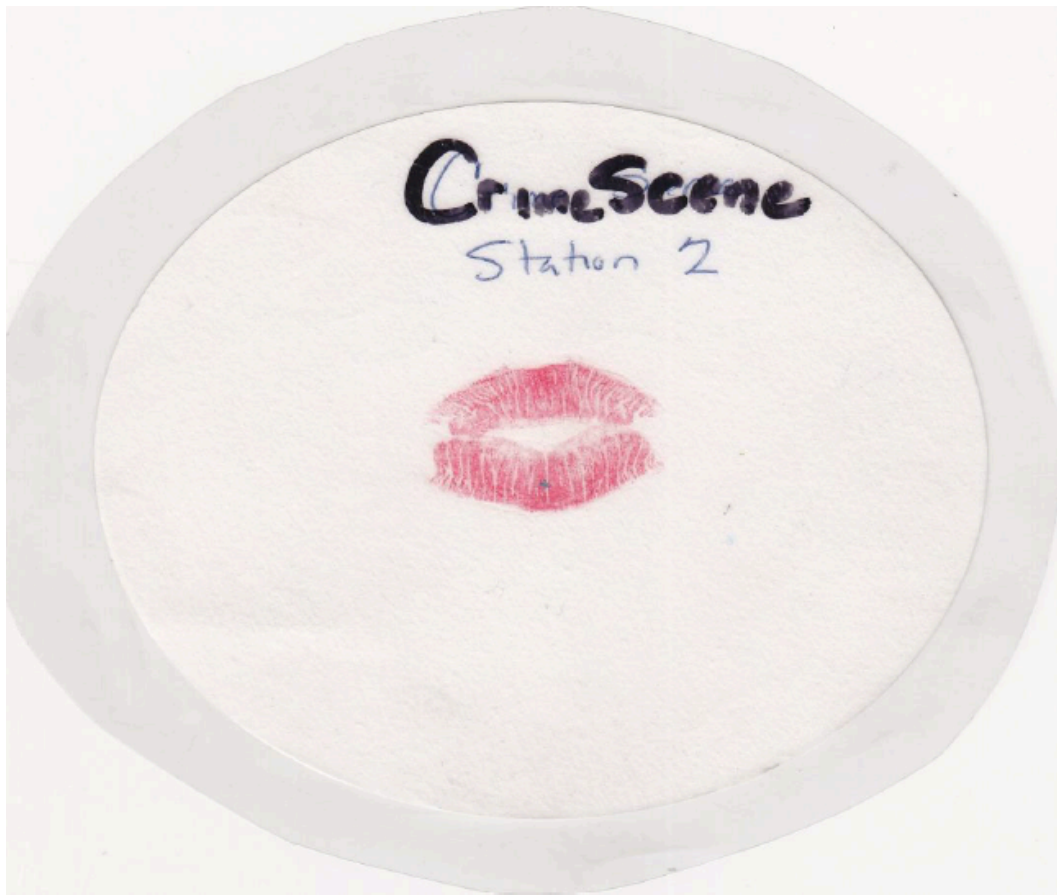
LIP PRINT ANALYSIS

Outside the window, you found a pop can. Using the chart for different lip print patterns as a reference, you are to:

- [a] identify the lip print pattern and
- [b] match the crime scene lip prints to the matching lip print pattern from the 4 samples.

Procedure:

1. Draw the lip print patterns into your booklet.
2. Carefully examine the lip print pattern from the crime scene (images are below).
3. Identify the pattern and record.
4. Select the correct lip print from the samples that matches the crime scene and record.
5. Answer the questions.
